

RIT Media Policies

► Media Credentials

Requests for media credentials for RIT home games at Ritter Arena must be made at least two days in advance by contacting Joe Venniro at (585) 475-5598 or via e-mail at jtvsid@rit.edu. Working press box credentials will be issued only to accredited newspapers, magazines, bloggers, radio or television reporters. Press credentials can be picked up in the Sports Information Office during the week or the Ritter Arena Press Box beginning two hours before game time.

► Press Box

RIT's press box is located in the south end of Ritter Arena and is accessible via the stairs located in the main concourse. The press box is a working area. Vulgarity, profanity, and cheering are prohibited. Any behavior deemed unprofessional by RIT staff will result in removal from the game.

▶ Press Box Services

The RIT Sports Information Department will provide line charts, weekly notes, programs, statistics, and media guides prior to the game. Game statistics and shot charts will be provided between periods and after each contest.

▶ Photography

Photo passes are limited to team photographers and accredited media (newspapers, bloggers, TV, print). All requests for passes must be made to Joe Venniro at least one day prior to the scheduled game.

▶ Radio

Ritter Arena has one phone line available for an opponent's (student or commercial) radio station, and is situated in the press box closest to the entrance. All visiting radio stations must request space at least three days prior to the game.

► Interviews

Coach Wayne Wilson is available for telephone interviews with the media during the week. Please contact Joe Venniro to arrange the interview at least one day prior to the requested interview date. Pre-game interviews with coaches and players must be arranged through the RIT Sports Information Department at least one day in advance. Following home games, Coach Wilson and RIT players will be available for a post-game press conference or interviews approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of the game. All post-game interview requests must be made through the SID in the press box prior to the final two minutes of the game. RIT maintains a strict closed-door locker room policy. Access to the locker room is limited to the players, coaches, and named Athletics Department staff.

► RIT on the Radio

All RIT men's hockey games are broadcast on WITR 89.7 FM in the Rochester area or online at witr.rit.edu. Scott Biggar '89, Chris Lerch '84, and Ed Trefzger '84 are the voices of the Tigers.

► RIT on the Web

RIT's official athletics website is www.ritathletics.com. The site features information on all 24 RIT Athletics teams. Fans can access live video at b2livetv.com for a small fee per game. Streaming radio broadcasts can be found online at witr.rit.edu.

► RIT on Television

All but one home game will be televised this season on Time Warner Cable Sports, which may be found on Time Warner Cable Channel 26 or 214 in the Rochester area. Games can be seen in high definition on Channel 1026. Gene Battaglia and John DiTullio bring you the action.

Coaching Staff



Head Coach *Wayne Wilson*



Wayne Wilson, now in his 12th season as head coach of the Tigers, enjoyed a magical year behind the bench in 2009-10. He, along with the Tigers, accrued a bevy of individual and team accomplishments, including the Spencer Penrose Award as Division I National Coach of the Year. Wilson became the first coach to win the National Coach of the Year at both the Division I and Division III levels. He led RIT to its first Atlantic Hockey Championship, and a spot in the NCAA Division I Tournament. The Tigers captured the attention of the country as they made their historic run to the Frozen Four, playing in front of 34,954 fans at Ford Field in Detroit. RIT finished the season with a school record 28 wins, including a 12-game winning streak from Feb. 12 to March 27. The Tigers finished the season ranked No. 10 in the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine National Poll, and were as high as ninth.

On Oct. 30, 2009, Wilson became the all-time leader in coaching wins at RIT, picking up his 189th victory in a 6-2 win over Connecticut. On Jan. 15, 2010, Wilson recorded his 200th win, as RIT blanked Connecticut, 4-0.

The Guelph, Ontario, native has led RIT to three AHA Regular Season Championships in the last four years. During that time, the Tigers have recorded a stellar 91-48-11 record, and are 77-26-9 in AHA play. Last season, the Tigers set AHA records for most wins (22) and points (45) in one season, winning the regular season title by 10 points.

During his tenure at RIT, Wilson has guided the Tigers to a 216-103-25 record. In just five seasons of Division I play, Wilson has led the Tigers to several victories over nationally ranked teams, including wins over No. 2 Denver, and No. 12 New Hampshire in the NCAA East Regional on March 26-27, 2010. Denver is the highest ranked team that RIT has beaten at the Division I level.

On Oct. 27, 2007, the Tigers defeated then No. 18 Cornell 4-1, and two months later, on Dec. 29, RIT shocked the Division I hockey landscape, defeating No. 14 Minnesota at the Dodge Holiday Classic in front of 10,046 fans at Mariucci Arena. It was the first time Minnesota had lost a game in their home tournament since the 1999-00 season.

In 2008-09, Wilson led the Tigers to a 23-13-2 mark, which included an 11-game winning streak, jump-started by a win over No. 10 Air Force. RIT was the second highest scoring team in the nation.

In 2007-08, forward Simon Lambert became the first RIT player to be named a finalist for the Hobey Baker Award, college hockey's finest honor. The season before, RIT won the Atlantic Hockey regular season title in its first year in the league.

Wilson is no stranger to success at the collegiate level. He won a national title as a player at Bowling Green State University in 1984. He led the Falcons to three NCAA Tournament appearances as an assistant coach.

Wilson led RIT to four NCAA tournament appearances and four ECAC West Tournament titles and was named the ECAC West Coach of the Year three times. He earned AHCA Coach of the Year honors in 2000-01 when he guided the Tigers to their fifth appearance in the NCAA Division III National Championship game after an

unbeaten regular season (22-0-1, finished 26-1-1).

During his time at RIT, Wilson has coached eight All-American selections (two-time selection Jerry Galway, Pat Staerker, Derek Hahn, Peter Bournazakis, Mike Bournazakis, Tyler Euverman, and Mike Tarantino). In 2001, Jerry Galway became only the second player in RIT history to be named NCAA Division III AHCA Player of the Year.

Last season, Jared DeMichiel and Dan Ringwald were the AHA Goaltender and Defenseman of the Year, respectively, and garnered first team honors. Ringwald earned All-USCHO.com second team honors and was a three-time All-AHA first team selection. Chris Tanev was named the 2010 AHA Rookie of the Year. Lambert won the Atlantic Hockey Leading scorer award in 2008. Overall, 13 different Tigers have earned 27 All-AHA honors since 2006-07.

Many of Wilson's players have graduated and moved on to professional careers within their field of study. Last season the team recorded a 3.25 GPA, exceeding the university average. Eighteen players earned AHA All-Academic team honors, including Mark Cornacchia, winner of the NCAA Elite 88 Award for Academic Excellence.

While at Bowling Green, several of Wilson's players (including Rob Blake, Nelson Emerson, and Brian Holzinger) went on to successful careers in the National Hockey League. In 2007, Steve Pinizzotto became the first Tiger to sign an NHL contract at the Division I level. Pinizzotto was a key component of the two-time Calder Cup Champion Hershey Bears of the AHL and may make his NHL debut in 2010-11. Since the end of the 2006-07 season, 19 players have gone on to sign pro contracts, including Tanev, who signed with the Vancouver Canucks in June, 2010.

Wilson earned a degree in health, physical education, and recreation from Bowling Green in 1984, and added his master's degree in education at BGSU in 1987. He lives in Pittsford with his wife, Lynn, and children Stephanie (21) and Stu (19). Stephanie is a senior at Bowling Green, and will begin an internship with the Washington Capitals in January, 2011. Stu will be playing for the Cedar Rapids Roughriders of the USHL in 2010-11, and has also committed to play at Yale in either 2011-12 or 2012-13.

Associate Head Coach *Brian Hills*



Brian Hills begins his sixth season at RIT, and fourth as the associate head coach. Hills, who joined RIT before its inaugural season of Division I play in 2005, has been a vital reason for RIT's success. He has played a major role in recruiting and building a team that won the 2010 Atlantic Hockey and NCAA East Region Championships and advanced to the Frozen Four. In addition, Hills helped lead RIT to three Atlantic Hockey Regular Season championships, and a 91-48-11 record since the start of the 2006-07 season.

Before his success at RIT, Hills was the head coach at SUNY Geneseo for four seasons. In his last season at Geneseo, he led the Knights to a record of 18-7-4, a SUNYAC Championship, the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division III Tournament, and a No. 7 ranking in the final Division III poll. Hills amassed a record of 53-42-14 while reviving the Geneseo hockey program. His record during his final two seasons at Geneseo was 32-14-9.

Prior to coaching at Geneseo, Hills worked for seven years at Division I Bowling Green. During that time he assisted with Team Canada's national team selection committee in 1997 and 1998. He also coached the Chur (Switzerland) Junior Hockey Team in 1986-87.

Hills is a graduate of Bowling Green State University, where he was a teammate of RIT Head Coach Wayne Wilson. Hills was a two-time All-American and two-time Hobey Baker Memorial Award finalist. He led the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) in scoring twice and was the CCHA Player of the Year in 1983. In addition, Hills was a two-time CCHA All-Academic team

member, and was a second team CoSIDA/GTE Academic All-American as a senior. The Falcons won the CCHA title during his junior and senior seasons. Hills left Bowling Green as its all-time leading scorer and is currently second on the list. He scored 116 goals and added 154 assists for 270 points in 156 games. In 1982-83 he set a school single-season record that still stands with 94 points (37-57-94) in 40 games. Hills led the Falcons in scoring during his final three seasons.

After graduating from Bowling Green with a degree in business administration, Hills spent 11 seasons playing professionally in Europe—eight years in Switzerland and three in Germany. He won three gold medals with Team Canada in Europe's Spengler Cup before returning to his alma mater, where he spent seven seasons as an assistant coach from 1994-2001.

"Brian is involved in all facets of our program, including on-ice, video, recruiting, and community service, and has been an invaluable asset to the RIT hockey program," said RIT Head Coach Wayne Wilson. "He is a proven winner and will no doubt be an excellent Division I head coach."

Hills lives in Honeoye Falls with his wife, Andrea. They have two children, a daughter Alexandra (21) and son Trevor (18). Alexandra is a junior forward on the nationally ranked RIT women's hockey team. Trevor is a senior at The Berkshire School in Sheffield, Mass, and plays for the school's hockey team. He won a gold medal for the Western team at the Empire State Games in 2010.



Assistant Coach *Dave Insalaco*

Dave Insalaco enters his third season as an assistant coach for the RIT men's hockey program.

Insalaco returned to Rochester after spending the last two seasons with the Green Bay Gamblers of the United States Hockey League. Midway through the 2007-08 season, he took over as the head coach and general manager, coaching current RIT juniors Cameron Burt and Taylor McReynolds, along with sophomore Chris Saracino. In 2006-07, Insalaco also coached Tiger captain Sean Murphy.

Insalaco began his coaching career in 2002-03 as a volunteer assistant at SUNY Brockport. In 2003-04, he moved to SUNY Geneseo as an assistant coach. There, he worked under current RIT Associate Head Coach Brian Hills for two seasons. During Insalaco's three seasons at SUNY Geneseo, the Ice Knights went 51-23-11 and earned two NCAA Division III Tournament berths.

In 2009, Insalaco coached at the USA Hockey Select Under-17 camp in Rochester with several of the nation's top collegiate coaches.

Insalaco played two years of professional hockey for the Adirondack IceHawks of the United Hockey League from 2000-02, recording 10 goals and 21 assists for 31 points in 128 career games. He quickly became a fan favorite in Adirondack, winning the Unsung Hero and 110 Percent Award as voted on by the fans in 2001-02. Insalaco helped lead Adirondack to a division title in 2000-01.

The Greece native played collegiately at SUNY Brock-

port from 1996-00. Insalaco tallied 47 goals and 62 assists for 109 points in 108 career games for the Golden Eagles. He is seventh all-time at SUNY Brockport in goals and 10th in points. Insalaco was an All-SUNYAC second team selection in 2000 and Chase Memorial Academic Athletic Scholarship winner.

"Dave is a young, smart, energetic coach," said RIT Head Coach Wayne Wilson. "He excels in recruiting, skill development, and video analysis, and understands the game very well. Dave's individual instruction with our players has made a big impact with our program."

In addition, Insalaco's sister Kim was a member of the 2006 United States Women's Olympic Hockey Team that earned a bronze medal in Turin, Italy. She is an assistant women's hockey coach at Cornell University.

Insalaco, who earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in education from SUNY Brockport, lives in Fairport with his wife, Erika.









Volunteer Assistant Coach *Mike Germain*

Mike Germain returns for his fifth season as a volunteer assistant coach. He will work primarily with the Tiger goaltenders.

Germain came to the Tigers after spending a season as an assistant coach with the American Hockey League's Rochester Americans. Before that, Germain was an associate coach for the Rochester Junior Americans for four seasons. For three seasons, Germain was the head coach of the Greece Lightning, one of the top high school teams in Rochester. In his first season, Germain led the Lightning to 17 wins and the New York state quarterfinals.

A 1994 graduate of SUNY Cortland and standout goaltender for the Red Dragons, Germain set single-season school records that still stand for most wins (17, 1992-93) and shutouts (2, 1991-92). He is also the Red Dragons all-time leader in wins (33) and shutouts (3).

Germain, who has a master's degree in educational administration from Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts

and a second master's degree in liberal studies from SUNY Brockport, started his coaching career as an assistant at Brockport from 1998-2000.

"Mike has become an integral part of our program," said RIT Head Coach Wayne Wilson. "His work with our goaltenders has been invaluable as evidenced by the improvement of Louis Menard, Jared DeMichel, and Jocelyn Guimond."

The Germain name should be familiar to RIT fans, as Mike's brother Lou played in goal for one season with the Tigers before transferring to SUNY Geneseo, where he earned All-American honors.

Germain is an assistant principal at John Marshall High School in the Rochester City School District.



Athletic Trainer/ Strength/ Conditioning Coach Tim Insko

Tim Insko begins his second season as the strength and conditioning coach and athletic trainer at RIT. He will be primarily responsible for working with the Tiger hockey team on and off the ice. In addition, he will supervise the Tiger Power Den and work in strength and conditioning with all 600-plus RIT student-athletes.

Prior to arriving at RIT, Insko spent three seasons working with the USA Hockey Bantam Camp in Ames, Iowa. During that time, he honed his craft at Division I Iowa State University, while obtaining a second bachelor's degree in kinesiology with an emphasis in athletic training, along with a master's degree in educational leadership and policy studies. He worked with the football and track and field teams, and mentored all first- and second-year athletic training students.

Insko was awarded the Robert Watkins and Mary

Swartz Athletic Training Student Award and was a Special Olympics and Drake Relays volunteer athletic training student while at Iowa State.

From 2001-06, Insko was a strength and conditioning specialist at Performace Therapies, P.C., in Coralville, Iowa. He administered strength and conditioning programs for the Cedar Rapids Roughriders hockey team and several high schools in the region. In addition, he was a physical therapy aide for one year at the University of Iowa Hospitals.

Insko received his first bachelor's degree in psychology in 1999 from the University of Iowa. He is certified by the National Athletic Training Association, and is a certified strength and conditioning specialist and corrective exercise specialist.

Season Outlook

What can the 2010-11 men's hockey team do for an encore after a historic 2009-10 season that was the stuff of legends? Last season, the Tigers, in just their fifth season as a Division I program, did the unthinkable, emerging as the country's Cinderella story, advancing to the NCAA Frozen Four. RIT won its first Atlantic Hockey Association Championship, and upended perennial powers Denver and New Hampshire to win the NCAA East Regional and reach the Frozen Four. They were the only team in Division I to win its regular season and postseason championships.

RIT, which won a school record 28 games last season and has 91 victories over the past four years, will try to win its second straight AHA title and return to the NCAA Tournament. The Tigers return a strong group of playoff-tested veterans and bring in an extremely talented group of newcomers.

RIT will play 34 regular season games this season, opening in Omaha, Neb., at the Mutual of Omaha Stampede against WCHA foes St. Cloud State and Nebraska at Omaha. St. Cloud State was one win away from facing RIT in the Frozen Four last season. RIT returns home to what could possibly be a sold-out house at Blue Cross Arena in downtown Rochester on Oct. 16, as Hockey East foe UMass Lowell, led by RIT Hall of Famer Blaise MacDonald, visits for Brick City Homecoming and Family Weekend. The following weekend, the Tigers travel east to face ECAC foes Rensselaer and Union, then travel to ECAC Champion and NCAA East Region participant Cornell to end October. The Tigers will also play a non-conference home game against Merrimack on Jan. 1, 2011.

"We have a pretty exciting non-conference schedule," said RIT Head Coach Wayne Wilson, now in his 12th year with the Tigers. "We play two tough WCHA teams (St. Cloud State and Nebraska at Omaha) right away, then come home to face a good Hockey East school in UMass Lowell as part of our Brick City Homecoming Weekend. Union was one of our top rivals at the Division III level, and Cornell has one of the toughest buildings to play in. We like to play a tough non-conference schedule that challenges us and makes us better for league and postseason play," said Wilson.

Twenty-seven of RIT's 34 games will be against Atlantic Hockey foes. The league, now in its eighth season, adds two new teams in Niagara and Robert Morris, both formerly of College Hockey America. The Tigers will travel to Pittsburgh, Pa., on Dec. 30 to play Robert Morris at the Consol Energy Center, brand new home of the Pittsburgh Penguins, as part of the NHL's Winter Classic festivities.

"Robert Morris and Niagara are two very strong programs that will challenge for the AHA title right away," said Wilson. "We are also proud to be a part of the Winter Classic festivities."

RIT will face Niagara, Robert Morris, Canisius, Mercyhurst, and Air Force three times this season, and will play Army, Connecticut, Holy Cross, Sacred Heart, American International, and Bentley twice.

Wilson, the all-time leader in coaching wins at RIT and winner of the 2010 Spencer Penrose Award as the Division I Coach of the Year, is thrilled that RIT has become not only a top AHA team, but one that has achieved national prominence.

"Our goal hasn't changed since we became eligible for postseason play (in 2007-08)," said Wilson. "Ultimately, our goal is to advance to the NCAA Tournament, which would mean putting ourselves in contention for home-ice advantage in the league tournament, and winning the Atlantic Hockey Championship," said Wilson. "From there you prepare one game at a time. With the success we had last year, you never know what that means, it could be one and done, but we now know a Frozen Four berth is attainable."

Seniors Andrew Favot and Sean Murphy, along with junior Chris Haltigin, will serve as the 2010-11 captains. Both Favot and Murphy were assistant captains last season.

"Our leadership will be tremendous this season," said Wilson. "Both Andrew and Sean are two-year captains, and along with Chris are very well respected by their teammates. We also have a lot of players who stepped up last season who will also be able to provide leadership."

The Tigers return 17 players from last season's squad and Wilson and his staff have recruited seven highly touted newcomers.

▶ Forwards

The Tigers return a strong group of talented forwards from an offense that finished fifth nationally in goals per game a year ago. With the addition of a group of accomplished freshmen, the offense could be even more prolific this season.

Favot, along with juniors Cameron Burt and Tyler Brenner, will lead the way. Burt and Favot led the team offensively with 47 and 46 points last season, while Brenner scored 15 goals.

Seniors Sean Murphy and Mike Janda, along with juniors Mark Cornacchia, Scott Knowles, and Taylor McReynolds and sophomores Adam Hartley, Jeff Smith, and Bryan Potts, will be expected to shoulder more of the offensive responsibilities. They all play strong two-way games and know what it takes to win at this level.

Freshmen Adam Mitchell, Michael Colavecchia, and Ben Lynch will look to step in and contribute. All three players enjoyed tremendous success at the junior level and will look to continue that at RIT.

"I think we will be the strongest up front that

we have ever been," said Wilson. "We return a great group of guys who are proven scorers, but also have several players who improved greatly last season and should continue to improve this season."

▶ Defensemen

The Tigers, who set a school record with eight shutouts and were fourth nationally, allowing 2.20 goals per game in 2009-10, enter the season with a very young defensive corps. Three of RIT's defensemen are juniors, with one sophomore and three freshmen. The Tigers will have to replace Dan Ringwald, Alan Mazur, and Chris Tanev, who combined for 88 points, and more importantly, a stifling defensive presence a season ago.

Junior captain Chris Haltigin is one of the top defensemen in the conference and should play an even greater role in 2010-11 after scoring 11 goals, and adding 13 assists for 24 points, earning a spot on the NCAA East Region All-Tournament Team.

Classmates Trevor Eckenswiller and Daniel Spivak will shoulder plenty of the defensive load. Eckenswiller, who missed most of last season due to injury, and Daniel Spivak are both strong defensively, and will be looked upon to provide leadership. Sophomore Chris Saracino enjoyed a strong first season with 12 points.

Wilson brought in a trio of highly touted blueliners in Nolan Descoteaux, Greg Noyes, and Eliot Raibl. All three are solid in their own end, can contribute offensively, and are strong skaters.

"We have a strong nucleus of returners, but our success will depend on the impact our three freshmen make," said Wilson. "Will they contribute immediately, or will we have to be patient? We lost three excellent defensemen in Dan Ringwald, Alan Mazur, and Chris Tanev, who all signed pro deals."

▶ Goalies

RIT will look to replace Jared DeMichiel, who was the NCAA East Regional MVP, AHA Goaltender of the Year, and led the nation with 27 wins last season. Senior Jan Ropponen, along with sophomore Shane Madolora and freshman Josh Watson, will vie for the starting role in a wide-open battle.

"We really like our three goalies," said Wilson.
"It will be interesting to see how they perform when the pressure is on. We will have to sort out if it will be a goalie-by-committee situation, or will one guy step up and take the job?"

RIT will once again have an eye on the postseason, as they battle the top teams in the country. They will look to secure a top seed for the Atlantic Hockey Championship and repeat as AHA Champions and try to make another deep run into the month of April.




Road to the Postseason

Despite losing its first five games of the season, RIT bounced back in a big way, setting Atlantic Hockey Association records with 22 wins and 45 points to claim its third regular season title in the last four seasons. RIT won the league title by 10 points and placed five players on the AHA All-Conference team. The Tigers were especially lethal at Ritter Arena, recording a 13-2 mark, outscoring opponents 69-26. RIT recorded a 10-game unbeaten streak from Oct. 30 to Dec. 5, then ended the regular season with a sixgame winning streak. The Tigers recorded five sellouts at Ritter Arena. RIT opened the season by drawing a Rochester record crowd of 7,421 fans to Blue Cross Arena against Colgate for Brick City Homecoming and Family Weekend. The Tigers ended the regular season among the national leaders in goals per game, goals allowed per game, power-play, and penalty killing efficiency.























RIT headed into the Atlantic Hockey Association Tournament as the top-seed, winning the league regular season crown by 10 points. The Tigers faced off against ninth-seed Connecticut in the best-of-three quarterfinal round. In game one, RIT pounded the Connecticut net, outshooting the Huskies 55-18, but needed a goal by Chris Haltigin 9:56 into overtime to take a 1-0 series lead. The next night, RIT ended the suspense much earlier, scoring four times in the first 30 minutes of the contest, rolling to a 4-1 win and series sweep.

The following weekend, RIT headed to Blue Cross Arena to face fifth-seeded Canisius in the semifinals. RIT was looking to break a fourgame losing streak at Blue Cross Arena, which including AHA semifinal losses in 2008 and 2009.

After a quick Canisius breakaway in the first minute of the game that was thwarted by Jared DeMichiel, RIT took control, scoring twice before the first period ended, then adding a powerplay goal in the second and third stanzas to cruise to a 4-0 win.

RIT would face second-seeded Sacred Heart in the AHA Championship. Just like the night before, DeMichiel would have to come up big in the first minute of play for RIT, making a key glove save. RIT settled down and took a 1-0 lead on a power-play goal by Cameron Burt just 2:16 in. Mark Cornacchia would score what proved to be the decisive goal in the final minute of the period, shorthanded to give RIT a 2-0 lead. From there, RIT poured it on, scoring three secondperiod goals to go up 5-0 after 40 minutes of play. RIT rolled through the third period and earned its first AHA Championship and first berth in the NCAA Tournament with a 6-1 win. Burt was named the AHA Tournament MVP after tying a Division I team record with five points (1-4-5) in the win. DeMichiel, Dan Ringwald, Chris Tanev, and Tyler Brenner were also named to the All-Tournament Team.










RIT headed just three hours east to Albany for the NCAA East Regionals, where their reward for winning the AHA title was a meeting against No. 2 Denver. It was billed as a meeting of David vs. Goliath, as Denver had 14 NHL Draft Picks on their roster and seven NCAA Championships to their credit. Very few people gave RIT any chance of staying in the game, let alone getting a win. RIT would make believers out of many by the time the game finished, as they earned a 2-1 victory, despite being out-shot 40-24. With the Pepsi Center turned into a sea of orange, RIT jumped to the early lead on a goal by Chris Tanev. Jared DeMichiel kept Denver off the board for the first two periods, stopping 26 shots through 40 minutes. With 7:24 left in regulation, Cameron Burt gave RIT a 2-0 lead on the power play. Denver would rally right back with a powerplay goal two minutes later, but DeMichiel and the RIT defense held on for the 2-1 win.

The following night, RIT would once again face a national power in No. 12 New Hampshire. Once again, RIT got on the board first, as Chris Haltigin tallied 14:10 into the game. New Hampshire would tie the game in the final minute of the period. RIT would break the game open by scoring three times in a team record 1:34 to go up 4-1. Tyler Brenner, Brent Alexin, and Stevan Matic scored the three decisive goals that would ultimately lift them to the Frozen Four. Brenner and Tyler Mazzei added third-period goals to send RIT to Detroit, 6-2 winners over New Hampshire. DeMichiel was named East Regional MVP after stopping 63 of 66 shots in the two games. Burt, Brenner, Haltigin, and Dan Ringwald were named to the All-Tournament Team.

When RIT arrived back on campus that night/ next morning just after 2 a.m., they were greeted by 1,000 fans who gave them an impromptu heroes' welcome. It was a sea of pride and jubilation that blanketed the campus, and continued on for the next two weeks.

Heading into the Frozen Four, RIT was the big story in college hockey. They had knocked off the big boys in the NCAA East Regional, despite not being able to offer any scholarships. There were over 125 different media requests in the week off before the Frozen Four.

National media such as ESPN, CBS Sportsline, *USA Today*, Yahoo Sports, and *The New York Times* all wanted to know more about RIT's success story. The Tigers were extremely loose leading up to the game, just like they had before the NCAA Regional.







In Detroit, it was more of the same, as RIT was the newcomer, among perennial powers Boston College, Miami, and Wisconsin. Native son Cameron Burt graced the front cover of both Detroit newspapers the day of the game. At Ford Field, 34,954 fans were in attendance to see if RIT could continue this magical run and advance to the National Championship. Unfortunately for RIT, they were unable to get by a strong Wisconsin team, falling 8-1. Tyler Brenner scored RIT's lone goal.

Despite RIT's loss to Wisconsin in the Frozen Four, RIT accomplished much more than anyone expected. Once again, when they arrived back on campus the following afternoon, hundreds of students, faculty, and staff gave the RIT hockey team a heroes' welcome home. The season was over, but it was an incredible journey, indeed.









RIT in the National Spotlight

After the amazing run to the Frozen Four, RIT received several local and national honors. Mark Cornacchia was named the NCAA Elite 88 Award Winner, presented to the student-athlete with the highest cumulative grade-point average participating at the finals site for each of the NCAA's 88 championships. Head Coach Wayne Wilson was named the winner of Spencer Penrose Award, given to the Division I national coach of the year. Dan Ringwald was named to the United States College Hockey Online second team, becoming the first Tiger to earn that national honor. Frontier Field, home of the Rochester Red Wings of the International League, held RIT Appreciation Night on May 17. Wilson, along with RIT President Bill Destler, received an honorary key to the city from Monroe County Executive Maggie Brooks. On August 15, the team was inducted into the 2010 Frontier Field Walk of Fame. Players, coaches, and staff received their championship rings from the 2009-10 season on September 3.

► Green B. Williams Award

Mark Cornacchia garnered the 2009-10 Green B. Williams Award for academic excellence.

The award is named in memory of Green B. Williams III, a native of Amherst, Mass., who majored in business administration and was a goaltender at RIT from 1973 to 1977. While at RIT, Williams received the RIT Hockey Outstanding Senior Award in 1977 and the Coaches Award for Outstanding Contribution to the RIT hockey team in 1976.

Six years after graduation, Williams (son of the late Charlotte E. Staab) joined the Air Force and was training to be a pilot. On March 21, 1984, with a month left in pilot training and eight days shy of his 28th birthday, Williams was killed in a mid-air collision during a training exercise.

Cornacchia, a finance major, finished 2010 with a sparkling 3.85 grade-point average, and was also named the winner of the 2010 NCAA Elite 88 Award, which recognizes the true essence of the student-athlete by honoring the individual who has reached the pinnacle of competition at the national champion-ship level in his or her sport, while also achieving the highest academic standard among his or her peers.

Last season, Cornacchia led the Tigers with three shorthanded goals, and tallied 14 points (7-7-14) in 39 games.

"Mark is an outstanding student, and was rewarded for his hard work in the classroom with the NCAA Elite 88 Award," said RIT Head Coach Wayne Wilson. "He is the type of student-athlete that we are trying to recruit to our program at RIT. He is a hard worker on and off the ice."

DeMichiel holds RIT Division I team records with 41 wins, goals against average (2.46), and shutouts (7). In AHA play, he led the league with a 21-4-1 mark, 1.78 goals against average, .932 save percentage, and five solo shutouts. He also was part of two shared shutouts.

"Jared was a pleasure to watch improve in his four years at RIT." said Wilson. "His work ethic was the key to his success. His confidence down the stretch was a catalyst for our success."

2009-10 Season Review

The 2009-10 RIT men's hockey team became the story of Division I college hockey after enjoying a magical run to the NCAA Frozen Four in just its fifth season at the Division I level. The Tigers became the first Atlantic Hockey Association squad to make the Frozen Four, and emerged as a national powerhouse. Head Coach Wayne Wilson won the Spencer Penrose Award as the national coach of the year.

RIT was the only team in Division I to win both its conference regular season and conference championships. The Tigers set AHA records with 22 wins and 45 points en route to capturing their third regular season title in four seasons. The Tigers continued their success into the Atlantic Hockey Tournament, sweeping Connecticut in the quarterfinals, before shutting out Canisius, 4-0, in the semifinals, and trouncing Sacred Heart, 6-1 in the championship game on March 20.

From there, it was on to the NCAA East Regional in Albany, where RIT upset No. 2 overall seed Denver 2-1, and advanced to the Frozen Four after defeating No. 12 New Hampshire 6-2 in the regional final.

RIT's storybook season ended in the Frozen Four semifinal to national runner-up Wisconsin in front of a program record crowd of 34,954 fans. The Tigers finished the season ranked No. 10 in the *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* national poll, and were ranked as high as ninth.

RIT set school records with 28 wins, and a 12-game winning streak. After starting 0-5, RIT rolled to a 28-7-1 mark over its final 36 games.

The Tigers finished fifth nationally in goals per game (3.54) and fourth in scoring defense (2.20), a school record. RIT was fourth nationally in scoring margin (1.34). RIT was the only team to be in the top five nationally in all three categories.

RIT enjoyed great scoring depth, with nine players scoring at least 20 points, and 16 in double figures. Seven Tigers scored at least 10 goals.

Senior defenseman Dan Ringwald earned 2009-10 All-USCHO second team honors. Ringwald, who was named the 2010 Atlantic Hockey Association Best Defenseman and earned AHA first team honors for the third straight season, tallied a career-best 37 points on 11 goals and 26 assists. In addition, he was a plus-22. He was third nationally among all defensemen in Division I with 37 points. Ringwald was named to the AHA Championship and NCAA East Regional All-Tournament teams. He is RIT's all-time leader in assists, games played, and points by a defenseman, and is second overall in points at the DI level.

In goal, senior Jared DeMichiel was the AHA Regular Season Goaltender of the Year and NCAA East Regional Most Outstanding Player. DeMichiel led the nation with 27 wins, was fourth nationally with a .724 winning percentage, seventh with a 2.09 goals against average, and 10th in save percentage (.921). DeMichiel holds RIT Division I team records with 41 wins, goals against average (2.46), and shutouts (7). In AHA play, he led the league with a 21-4-1

mark, 1.78 goals against average, .932 save percentage, and five solo shutouts. He also was part of two shared shutouts.

Up front, sophomore Cameron Burt led the Tigers in scoring with 47 points (16-31-47), was named the AHA Tournament Most Outstanding Player, and earned NCAA East Region All-Tournament Team honors. Burt finished with 29 points (7-22-29) over his last 16 games, and was an All-Atlantic Hockey third team selection.

Junior Andrew Favot was right behind Burt with 46 points on 13 goals and 33 assists to garner All-Atlantic Hockey second team honors. Favot teamed with sophomore Tyler Brenner and junior Tyler Mazzei to form an explosive line that would be RIT's most consistent as the season progressed. Brenner shook off an early season injury to score 15 goals and add 11 assists in 33 games. Brenner was named to the Atlantic Hockey and NCAA East Regional All-Tournament teams. Mazzei finished with 25 points on 10 goals and 15 assists.

Senior forwards Stevan Matic and Brent Alexin finished their collegiate careers in style. Alexin tallied a career-high 21 points and was plus-19. Matic, a captain, chipped in with 18 points. In addition, junior captain Sean Murphy tallied 19 points and provided solid leadership.

Freshman Adam Hartley stepped in and played all 41 games, tallying 18 points and was plus-13. Hartley centered a line with Alexin and sophomore Scott Knowles. Knowles, a gritty forward, chipped in with 17 points and was plus-11.

Sophomore Mark Cornacchia, who won the NCAA Elite 88 Award for academic excellence, led the squad with three shorthanded goals. Cornacchia centered a line with junior Mike Janda and sophomore Taylor McReynolds. Both Janda and McReynolds provided a strong physical presence. In addition, freshmen Jeff Smith and Bryan Potts gained valuable experience as the season progressed and will be counted on to step up in 2010-11.

RIT's defensive unit, which included Ringwald, freshman Chris Tanev, sophomore Chris Haltigin, senior Alan Mazur, freshman Chris Saracino, and sophomores Daniel Spivak and Trevor Eckenswiller, helped record a school-record eight shutouts and post the fourth-lowest goals against average in the nation.

Ringwald, Tanev, and Haltigin all recorded at least 10 goals to headline a strong offensive blue-line group. That group, which also included Mazur (23 points) and Saracino (12 points), were the highest scoring defensive unit in the nation, averaging 3.11 points per game.

Tanev was named the AHA Rookie of the Year and earned third team honors after recording 28 points on 10 goals and 18 assists to go along with a plus-33 rating, second best in all of Division I. He was named to the AHA Championship All-Tournament Team. Haltigin scored 11 goals and added 13 assists for 24 points, and was named to the NCAA East Region All-Tournament Team.

Mazur concluded his career at RIT by scoring eight goals and adding 15 assists. He finished his collegiate career as the all-time leader in goals by a Tiger defenseman (27) and is tied for third overall with 99 points. Saracino emerged as a strong defender, finishing with 12 points, while Spivak played in 32 games.

Freshman goaltender Shane Madolora appeared in five games, and earned his first collegiate win over Sacred Heart. Jan Ropponen also appeared in two games.

When RIT made the move to Division I in 2005, it was rare to hear about RIT hockey standouts continuing their dream on the ice after wowing the Ritter Arena faithful. Since 2007, 19 Tigers have moved on to play in the professional ranks. These Tigers are living their dream of playing pro hockey, spread out all over the globe, from Quebec, to Italy; Germany to Slovenia; Belgium to Texas.


Steve Pinizzotto was the first Tiger to leave school early, signing a contract with the Washington Capitals in 2007, after his sophomore season. Last season, Pinizzotto played a key role in leading the Hershey Bears of the American Hockey League to their second straight Calder Cup Championship. There is a strong possibility that Pinizzotto could become RIT's first player to play in the NHL this season, as he will be competing for a spot on the Washington Capitals roster.

After RIT's amazing run to the Frozen Four last season, interest in Tiger players, upperclassmen and underclassmen, hit a crescendo. Defenseman Chris Tanev, the 2010 Atlantic Hockey Association Rookie of the Year, signed a deal with the Vancouver Canucks in June. Jared DeMichiel and Dan Ringwald, the 2010 AHA Goaltender and Defenseman of the Year, respectively, each signed American Hockey League deals. DeMichiel signed with Hershey, while Ringwald inked a deal with the Hartford Wolf Pack. Fellow 2010 graduates Stevan Matic and Alan Mazur signed ECHL contracts, while Tyler Mazzei is playing in the Netherlands.

Several RIT alumni, such as 2008 Hobey Baker Finalist Simon Lambert, Justin Hofstetter, Matt Crowell, and Stephen Burns currently play in Europe. Numerous players play in the ECHL, trying to fulfill a lifelong dream.

"It's exciting knowing that their dreams of playing in the NHL and receiving interest from NHL teams is that much more attainable now," says RIT Head Coach Wayne Wilson. "We've gone from a program where there was very little recognition in the pro ranks to now having guys that have a chance to make a name for themselves five, six, or even 10 years down the road at the highest level. Our players consider themselves Tigers for life and have a committed sense of pride in what they accomplished at RIT."

Wilson (1988-99) mentored several players who have enjoyed excellent careers in the NHL, including Norris Trophy winner and three-time All-Star defenseman Rob Blake, while he was an assistant coach at Bowling Green University. Wilson also coached former NHL players Dan Bylsma (2009 Stanley Cup Champion Head Coach of the Pittsburgh Penguins), Kevin Dahl, Iain Duncan, Nelson Emerson, Brett Harkins, Peter Ratchuk, Paul Ysebart, and former Rochester American and Buffalo Sabre Brian Holzinger. Wilson and Hills have also coached current NHL players Greg deVries, and Kevin Bieska.



Chris Tanev signed a contract with the Vancouver Canucks in 2010. He appeared in several pre-season games and is expected to have a greater role in 2011-12.



Steve Pinizzotto was called up to the Washington Capitals on March 24, 2009, skated in warm-ups, but did not play. He will begin 2010 training camp with the Capitals.


"Everything we do in the weight room will have the ultimate purpose of winning on the ice," said Insko.

The Center for Student Conduct and Conflict Management Services provides RIT students and the community with fair and educationally based responses to non-academic RIT policy violations and campus based conflicts. The following processes and services are available:

Student Conduct Hearing process — The Student Conduct hearing process is utilized to respond when students are accused of misconduct. Students have the opportunity to discuss the incident in question with an RIT administrator who serves as a hearing officer. The hearing officer's responsibility is to determine if the student should be held accountable for violating RIT Policies as well as determining appropriate educational responses or sanctions.

Advocacy Services — The Advocacy Program is an Institute initiative to provide students with a supportive partner when they are engaged in the student conduct process. An Advocate's role is to be a resource to the student and to participate fully in the student conduct hearing. Students may request an Advocate by contacting the Center for Student Conduct & Conflict Management Services.

Mediation Services — RIT's Mediation Service is a process through with RIT students, organizations, faculty or staff who are in conflict, can meet with trained mediators to discuss ways in which they can resolve their problems or differences. The process is confidential, voluntary and has a history of success.

Restorative Conferencing—The Restorative Conferencing process provides an alternative response to certain violations of the RIT Code of Conduct. Restorative Conferencing seeks to resolve violations of community expectations in a manner that satisfactorily meets the needs of all parties affected by an incident.

Conflict Coaching- Individual consultation is provided to students to assist in the identification of positive conflict management strategies.

Workshops & Presentations—Professional staff members are available to provide customized group programs on a variety of topics related to student behavior and campus conflicts.



Rochester at a Glance



Greater Rochester International Jazz Festival

High-tech industry, entertainment, history and culture, sports and recreation—you'll find it all in Rochester. The Genesee River—one of the few north-flowing rivers in the world—cuts through the center of the city, where it tumbles 96 feet at High Falls before flowing into Lake Ontario.

The Greater Rochester area is home to more than 1 million people, making it the third-largest metropolitan area in New York state. There are more than a dozen colleges and universities located in the area, where more than 60,000 undergraduate and graduate students call Rochester "home." RIT's 1,300-acre campus is located in the suburb of Henrietta, about six miles from downtown.

First settled in the early 1800s, Rochester quickly became the largest flour-producing city in the world. Today, the community is frequently labeled the "World's Imaging Center," due in part to the corporate influence of Eastman Kodak, Xerox, and Bausch & Lomb. The area is also home to highprofile companies like Wegmans Food Markets, Paychex, and Constellation Brands. Good suburban public schools, affordable housing, and ease of commute are also some of the reasons Rochester was ranked by *Expansion Management* magazine in 2007 as having the best quality of life among the top 50 metro areas in the United States. Also in 2007,

Places Rated Almanac ranked Rochester as the sixth best place to live in America. These are among a number of national rankings that you will find on Rochester, ranging from U.S. News & World Report to Popular Science.

Explore the Finger Lakes and Lake Ontario

From the wine country of the Finger Lakes (nearly 100 wineries) to the shores of Lake Ontario, Greater Rochester has a rich and vibrant character. You will find historic architecture, festivals, and plenty of shopping, dining, and entertainment options throughout the region. If you love the outdoors, there are parks, beaches, golf courses, ski resorts, mountains, gorges, lakes, and streams to provide opportunities for recreation and sightseeing. RIT is also a proud partner of the New York Wine & Culinary Center, located in nearby Canandaigua.

A sports town during any season

Rochester is home to several professional sports teams, including the Red Wings (baseball), Americans (ice hockey), Knighthawks (indoor lacrosse), and the Rhinos (soccer). Each summer, the Buffalo Bills training camp comes to town. Rochester is also home to an annual stop on the LPGA tour at Locust Hill Country Club, which hosted a major tournament in 2010. World-ranked Oak Hill Country Club also hosted the 2008 PGA Senior Championship and will host the 2013 PGA Championship. In addition, the fabled course has been the site of many other major golf championships, including the 1989 U.S. Open and 1995 Ryder Cup.

For more than a century, the standard for intercollegiate athletics has been established at Rochester Institute of Technology, where student-athletes excel both in the classroom and in competition.

U.S. News & World Report has named RIT one of the leading comprehensive universities in the north in terms of academic reputation for more than two decades. RIT's student-athletes are no exception.

Last year, student-athletes posted an impressive 3.19 grade-point average on a 4.0 scale, exceeding the university average of 3.05. The men's hockey team recorded a stellar 3.21 grade-point average. Mark Cornacchia (finance) and Sean Murphy (civil engineering technology) recorded the two highest grade-point averages on the RIT men's hockey team in 2009-10. Cornacchia was also named the winner of the 2010 NCAA Elite 88 Award, which honors the student-athlete with the highest cumulative grade-point average participating at the finals site for each of the NCAA's 88 championships.

Today, RIT offers 24 varsity sports, including men's and women's cross country, men's and women's crew, men's and women's soccer, women's tennis, and women's volleyball in the fall.

Winter competition includes men's and women's basketball, men's and women's ice hockey, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's indoor track, and wrestling. Spring competition features baseball, men's and women's crew, men's and women's lacrosse, softball, men's tennis, and men's and women's outdoor track.

Each year, 650 student-athletes compete on RIT athletics teams. Five percent of these athletes are hearing-impaired students enrolled in the National Technical Institute for the Deaf, one of RIT's eight colleges.

With the exception of men's ice hockey, which will be playing its sixth season as a Division I program, RIT is a Division III institution that joined the NCAA in 1958. The Tigers compete in the Atlantic Hockey Association, Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC), and Empire 8. In 2011, the Division III programs will join the Liberty League.

Numerous student-athletes have been honored for their excellent work not only on the field, but in the classroom. This past season, men's hockey and baseball standouts **Dan Ringwald** and **Geoff Dornes** shared the Male Senior Athlete of the Year, while **Caitlyn Burr** of the women's swimming and diving squad garnered the Female Athlete of the Year Award.

Ringwald led the Tigers to their first Atlantic Hockey Association title and NCAA Frozen Four appearance in 2010, while earning 2009-10 All-USCHO second team honors. Ringwald, who was named the 2010 AHA Best Defenseman and earned AHA first team honors for the third straight season, helped lead RIT to a school-record 28 wins. He was third nationally among all defensemen with 37 points on 11 goals and 26 assists. He was named to the AHA Championship and NCAA East Regional All-Tournament teams. For his career, Ringwald finished with 21 goals and 104 assists for 125 points in 145 career games. He is RIT's all-time leader in assists and games played, and is second all-time in points. Ringwald was also a four-time Atlantic Hockey All-Academic Team selection. He was a part of three AHA regular-season championship squads.

Dornes, a three-time Empire 8 Player of the Year, hit .333 in 2010 with two homers, 32 RBIs, 27 walks, and eight stolen bases. Dornes was excellent on the mound, going 4-4 with a sparkling 2.48 earned run average, and 48 strikeouts. He was a 2010 All-Empire 8 first team selection as a utility player, and second team selection as a pitcher. Dornes became the first RIT player to earn All-Empire 8 first team honors in all four seasons of play. Dornes completed his collegiate career as RIT's all-time leader in hits (199), runs scored (138), at-bats (518), triples (14), runs batted in (111), and walks (75), while in the top 10 in batting average (.384), slugging percentage (.539), on-base percentage (.469), and doubles (31). Dornes was a three-time ABCA/Rawlings New York Region selection, earned Empire 8 weekly honors nine times, and RIT Male Athlete of the Week honors five times. He was featured in Sports Illustrated as one the "Faces in the Crowd" on June 30, 2008.

Burr, a 2010 Co-SIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-American, was also a two-time honorable mention All-American. Burr won 35 events in 2009-10, and made her third straight appearance at the NCAA Championships. Burr holds eight different individual RIT school records and five relay records. Burr, the 2009 UNYSCSA Swimmer of the Meet, was honored with the Barbara Radef Award for academic and athletic excellence in 2010. She won six individual titles at the UN-YSCSA Championships in four seasons. Burr was the 2007 Empire 8 Rookie of the Year, and a six-time All-Empire 8 first team selection. Burr was a 10-time Empire 8 Swimmer of the Week and was the RIT Female Athlete of the Week nine times during her career.

Lou Spiotti Jr., Director for the Center of Intercollegiate Athletics and Recreation, believes that the student-athletes' remarkable cumulative GPA is a testament to their hard work and dedication to not only the playing field, but the classroom as well.

'The RIT student-athletes epitomize the Greek ideal of 'sound body, sound mind," said Spiotti. "The discipline and the work ethic required to succeed in athletics are transferable skills. What I mean by this is that athletes succeed in many aspects of their lives because they understand and embrace the world of competition and achievement both on the field of play and in the classroom. They push themselves to reach for higher levels of success. I believe that for them to be as good as they have demonstrated it takes focus, discipline, goal setting, good health and stamina, and excellent time management skills. All these things and more help them not only to progress through their college years, but also to excel. Thus, we have our student-athletes achieving a 3.19 overall grade-point average, which is significantly higher than the general student population."





A new chapter in the history of college hockey was ushered into existence when the Atlantic Hockey Association was created on June 30, 2003, by nine charter members. The sixth Division I men's ice hockey conference arose when the founding members—American International, Bentley, Canisius, Connecticut, Holy Cross, Mercyhurst, Quinnipiac, Sacred Heart, and the United States Military Academy (Army)—required an organization that represented their specific needs. The group of nine broke away from their former conference affiliation, the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference, and formed a conference specific to the sport of ice hockey.

Robert DeGregorio, former commissioner of Hockey East, was named the conference's first commissioner and played an integral role in the development of the league as play between the nine squads began in the fall of 2003. As the season unfolded, the fledgling conference made its mark in college hockey with victories over non-conference opponents, along with an exciting chase to claim the first-ever regular season title. Holy Cross secured the title, and followed up that feat by capturing the tournament championship, sending the Crusaders to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in the program's, and the league's, history.

Since the 2006-07 season, AHA's conference championship has been held at Blue Cross Arena in downtown Rochester.

RIT, in its first season as a member of the conference, won the regular season title but was unable to participate in the Atlantic Hockey Tournament due to NCAA regulations. An all-service academy championship ensued, as Air Force defeated Army to earn a berth into the 2007 NCAA Tournament.

During the 2007-08 season, five teams entered the final two weekends of the regular season with a chance to secure the top seed. Army earned the top seed, but it was Air Force that defeated Mercyhurst in double overtime to claim its second straight conference title.

In 2008-09, Air Force and RIT split the regular season title, both with what was then an AHA record-setting total of 42 points. For the third straight season, the Falcons won the conference tournament, blanking Mercyhurst.


Last season, RIT set conference records with 22 wins and 45 points, rolling to the AHA regular season title. It was no different in the postseason, as RIT outscored its foes 18-5 in winning its four playoff games, including a 6-1 win over Sacred Heart in the championship game.

Success in the classroom is as important as success on the ice among the member institutions of Atlantic Hockey. A total of 140 student-athletes were named to the 2009-10 Atlantic Hockey All-Academic squad in recognition of their outstanding scholastic achievement. Atlantic Hockey athletes have also contributed their time off the ice to numerous charitable organizations as a way of saying thanks to their many supporters.

Currently, Atlantic Hockey spans a total of five states: four in the northeast and one western state, reaching from the Atlantic Ocean to the banks of the Great Lakes and out to the Colorado Rocky Mountains. Robert Morris and Niagara will join the conference for the 2010-11 season. Members reside in Connecticut (University of Connecticut, Quinnipiac, Sacred Heart), Massachusetts (American International, Bentley, Holy Cross), New York (Army, Canisius, Niagara, RIT), Pennsylvania (Mercyhurst, Robert Morris), and Colorado (Air Force).



RIT players and coaches are extremely active in the Rochester community, working with several causes over the last few seasons. On Jan. 30, 2010, RIT fans traded orange apparel for pink over the weekend and in the process raised \$21,248 to fight cancer. Zeta Tau Alpha sorority teamed up with the RIT men's and women's hockey teams in the "Pink Rink" event, where Ritter Arena transformed into a sea of pink. Pink Tiger jerseys (25 men, 21 women) were auctioned off through Sunday and proceeds reached \$9,248. Jersey proceeds went to Rochester General Hospital's Lipson Cancer Center. Zeta Tau Alpha also raised more than \$12,000 from T-shirt sales. Those sales benefited the Susan G. Komen Cancer Foundation. Every season, RIT has its annual "Skate With the Tigers" event, which raises money for Coaches Care. Tiger players also read to various students in the area.

















1985 NCAA Champions - 25 Years







On October 16, members of RIT's Division III National Championship team will celebrate its 25th anniversary at Blue Cross Arena for the Tigers contest against UMass Lowell. RIT finished the season with a 26-6-1 record and outscored its opponents 222-89. Nine players scored at least 10 goals, while 17 Tigers tallied at least 10 points. Goaltender Chet Hallice, a 2010 inductee into the RIT Athletics Hall of Fame, was named the NCAA Tournament Most Outstanding Player. Chris Johnstone, RIT's alltime leading scorer, capped off his collegiate career by leading the team in scoring with 57 points (23-34-57). Larry Shompe scored a team-leading 32 goals. The Tigers defeated St. Thomas, 5-4 and 5-2, in the opening round of the tournament, before defeating Union 3-2 in the semifinal. RIT rolled to a 5-1 win over Bemidji State in the championship, giving them their second title in three seasons.

Men's Hockey History

2010-11 Men's Ice Hockey

In 1961, Director of Athletics L.A. Alexander, Jr., wrote a letter to the Athletic Committee recommending that the committee approve the establishment of an intercollegiate hockey team at Rochester Institute of Technology. The measure was approved four years later in 1965.

The hockey club was founded in the fall of 1959. It was given a budget of \$1,020 to purchase the initial equipment to outfit 16 players. At that time, the team participated in the Monroe County Amateur Hockey Association, playing 13 games against three other league teams. The players paid \$195 out of their own pockets for these games and coached themselves along the way, as they didn't have the money to hire a head coach.

The next year, with a budget of just \$927, the season was composed entirely of away games, because the league was dissolved due to a lack of ice time at the Rochester War Memorial. With the help of Alexander, games were played against Hamilton JV, Colgate freshmen, Ithaca, Cornell freshmen, the University of Rochester, the University of Toronto, and the local hockey club "The Rockets."

In 1961-62, the budget was increased to \$1,113.20 with the help of the RIT Student Council. There were 14 games played on home ice, which at the time was the Rochester War Memorial. Those interested in playing on the team exceeded 45 men. This is the first year they had actual guidance, as James E. Musker became the volunteer coach. With the new NCAA rules, the school was required to purchase helmets for the team at a cost of \$62.50.

Although hockey had never been played at the Ritter-Clark Rink (as it was previously called), it can be said that the facility was built with hockey in mind. This is verified by two important factors: a) the rink was built to hockey specifications as to length and width of ice surface, and b) inserts were provided in the concrete floor to accommodate hockey goals. In 1961, backed by the Student Association and President Marvin Pozefsky, renovations were made to the Ritter-Clark Rink so that the RIT men's ice hockey team could call it their own.

In 1962, the team formed a league with other teams in the area who faced similar problems, either with money, ice time, or scholarships. The league was known as the Finger Lakes Collegiate Hockey League (FLCHL). It consisted of six schools: RIT, Brockport, Hobart, Ithaca, the University of Rochester, and Syracuse University.

Three years later, in 1965, men's ice hockey became an official varsity sport. In 1972-73, the team became a member of the ECAC Division III. The ECAC was composed of two divisions, East and West. RIT played under the East Division.

In 1980, the RIT men's hockey program made a giant step forward by moving to the Division II level of play. This meant playing a challenging 25-game schedule featuring 16 matches against Division II teams. RIT also began playing in the New York State College Hockey League (NYSCHL), comprised solely of Division II schools. The league folded in 1985-86.

The 1982-83 season marked a milestone in the program, as the Tigers won their first NCAA Championship in Division II. In the two-game quarterfinal series, RIT defeated Mankato State and went on to beat Lowell 4-1 in the semifinals, advancing them to the championship game, where they defeated Bemidji State, 4-2.

The next year RIT moved to the Division III level. The Tigers repeated again as champions in 1984-85, this time at the Division III level, defeating Bemidji State once again, by a score of 5-1.

In 1988-89 the ECAC Division III formed two more divisions, adding a North and a South Division. With this change, RIT moved to the ECAC West and continued its status as a powerhouse in that division, winning seven conference titles in 17 seasons, including four straight, from 1998 to 2002.

The Tigers have made multiple trips to the big show—13, in fact. In 1988-89, RIT tied the first game in the two-game series against Wisconsin-Stevens Point, but ended its post-season play in the second game of the series, losing 3-2. In 1995-96, RIT made it to the championship game, losing 3-2 to Middlebury. In 2000-01, the team was ranked No. 1 in the nation the entire season and undefeated until losing the championship contest to SUNY Plattsburgh.

On December 15, 2004, RIT President Albert Simone and Director of Athletics Lou Spiotti annouced that the Tigers would be moving to the Division I level starting with the 2005-06 season. RIT became a full-fledged member of the Atlantic Hockey Association in 2006-07.

In 2006-07, RIT's second year as a Division I program and first as a member of Atlantic Hockey, the Tigers won the conference's regular season title. They finished the season with a 20-7-1 conference mark and won 21 games overall. The 21 wins against Division I competition were an improvement of 17 over its first season.

On March 7-8, 2008, the Tigers played their first post-season games, as a Division I program, defeating Holy Cross both nights in overtime by scores of 5-4 in the Atlantic Hockey Association Quarterfinals.

In 2008-09, RIT set a Division I school record by winning 23 games, and was victorious in 11 straight contests. The Tigers advanced to the AHA semifinals and were second nationally in goals per game (3.89).

Last season, the Tigers made history by not only winning their first AHA Championship, but then shocking the nation by upsetting No. 2 Denver and No. 12 New Hampshire to win the NCAA East Regional and advance to the Frozen Four in just its fifth season as a Division I squad. Head Coach Wayne Wilson was named the Spencer Penrose Award as the national coach of the year.

RIT was the only team in Division I to win both its conference regular season and conference championships. At the Frozen Four in Detroit, Mich., RIT played in front of a school-record 34,954 fans. The Tigers were nationally ranked for the first time, and finished the season No. 10 in the *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* national poll, after climbing as high as ninth.

RIT set school records with 28 wins, and a 12-game winning streak.

RIT has proven to be a top team at the Division I level, just as it was at the Division II and III levels. What history will the Tigers make in 2010-11?

Frank Ritter Ice Arena is home to the Rochester Institute of Technology men's and women's hockey teams, as well as the Genesee Figure Skating Club. The arena has hosted four NCAA Championships, most recently in 2000-01. In 2008, the arena celebrated its 40th anniversary.

Formerly known as Shumway Arena, the facility has undergone several renovations. A new sound system, lights, ceiling, and dasher boards have been added to help make Ritter Arena one of the best facilities in the Atlantic Hockey Association. In the last four years, both team locker rooms were renovated, a visitor's locker room was added, and the compressors were replaced. In 2008, a state-of-theart television studio was built to accommodate live hockey broadcasts on Time Warner Cable Sports. RIT is one of a handful of Division I programs that can broadcast games in high definition.

Starting in October, 2010, a 3.5-million-dollar project will begin to expand the current men's and women's hockey locker rooms, with coaching offices and video and training rooms to be added in the lower level of the arena. The project is slated to be finished in April, 2011.

► Game Night Atmosphere

With its intimate capacity of 2,100 (1,600 sitting, 500 standing), fans are right on top of the action. With the "Corner Crew" leading the way, fans at Ritter Arena cheer loudly and often. The crowds are among the most boisterous and loudest in Division I, and give the Tigers a distinct home-ice advantage. There are a plethora of banners celebrating RIT hockey's several conference and NCAA championships. In addition, there are several different promotions and special events between periods, making Ritter Arena the place to be on campus during the winter months.

▶ History

The arena is named after one of Rochester's most distinguished citizens. Frank Ritter was a founder of Rochester Athenaeum and Mechanics Institute (now RIT). He served on the Board of Trustees from 1885 to 1903, and was founder of Ritter Company, later a part of Sybron Co. The arena was dedicated in his honor in 1968.

► Media and Special Guests

Overlooking the south end is the John D. Pike Press Box, dedicated on Nov. 18, 1985. The facility is a gift of the John D. Pike Construction Co. and is named in honor of the company's founder. The press box has areas for media and special guests of the university, and complements one of the finest university skating facilities in the United States.

▶ Facilities

Located beneath the seating section are hockey locker rooms, made possible by major gifts from the Shumway Foundation and the Landsman Development Corporation.

► Special Activities

Numerous other activities have taken advantage of the arena's facilities. Some of these include:

- Rochester Americans preseason exhibition games
- McQuaid Jesuit High School Tournament
- · Empire State Games Championships

The arena also hosts the Tiger Hockey School, and the Genesee Figure Skating Club has conducted its 48th Annual Skating Academy. Learn-to-Skate classes and public skating are also offered throughout the year.
